STUDENT AWARDS

The CWB Welding Foundation is a registered charity that supports the Canadian welding industry by raising awareness and delivering programs to address the welding skilled trade shortage and mismatch in Canada.

We develop and facilitate education-based programs and initiatives—beginning in elementary school and into career and professional development and re-skilling—to reduce barriers that affect key groups: elementary, secondary, and post-secondary students and educators, Indigenous, women, at-risk youth, and other groups.

The Foundation provides a range of awards and bursaries to help students continue their welding education.

THE JOSEPH G. DORIA EXEMPLARY STUDENT AWARDS

This award was established in 2013 to promote and encourage the pursuit of a career in welding. It is meant to support graduating Canadian secondary school students entering a full-time post-secondary welding technician, welding fabrication or welding engineering technology program.

THE HUGH A. KRENTZ EXEMPLARY STUDENT AWARDS

This award was established in 2015 to support students entering their final year of post-secondary college, polytechnic or university undergraduate studies with a welding focus. Minimum of a 2-year program length in a welding-related program required.

Open to Ontario residents, the Nicole LeClair Welding Bursary Award was created to support welding students who are pursuing welding at the post-secondary education level at a publicly funded institution within Ontario. INDSPIRE BUILDING BRIGHT FUTURES AWARDS

The CWB Welding Foundation provides funding each year in support of Indspire's "Building Brighter Futures" awards program, which are further matched by the Government of Canada to provide between 7-10 financial bursaries (amounts are flexible depending on the financial need) for Indigenous students interested in post-secondary programs and training as it relates to careers in the welding and joining industry in Canada. Awards Value:

- Up to ten bursaries with an average value of \$2,200 (the CWB Welding Foundation contribution) to be matched by Inspire, totaling 10 bursaries of \$4,400 (average value). The amount of each bursary to be determined by Indspire.
